The Salt River Police Department holds accreditation from the Arizona Chiefs Of Police Association Law Enforcement Accreditation Program. Originally accredited in 2020, we take pride in being one of just four tribal police departments nationwide with this achievement. It reflects our commitment to serving the Community with excellence and upholding the highest law enforcement standards.

Law enforcement accreditation involves a challenging and a voluntary process where police departments showcase their commitment to state and nationally recognized standards of excellence. These standards encompass all aspects of law enforcement operations. Programs like the Arizona Law Enforcement Accreditation Program (ALEAP) establish the benchmark for professional excellence, requiring agencies to prove their compliance through documentation, inspections, and evaluations.



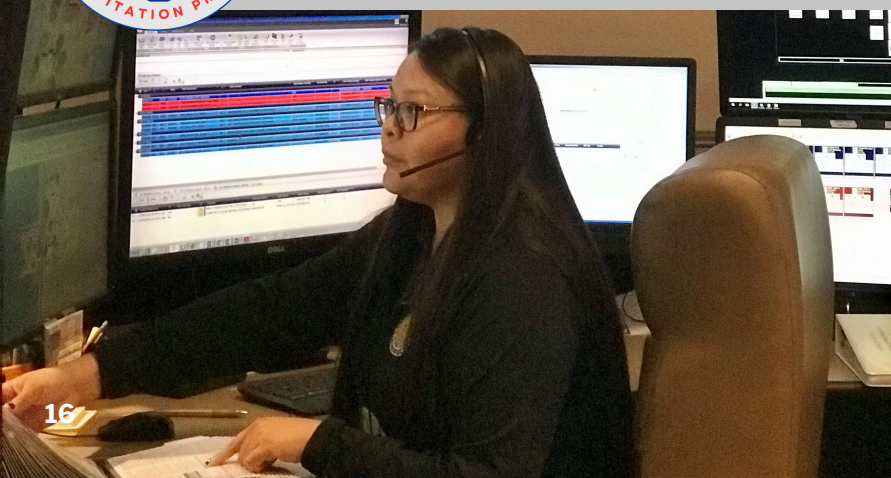
