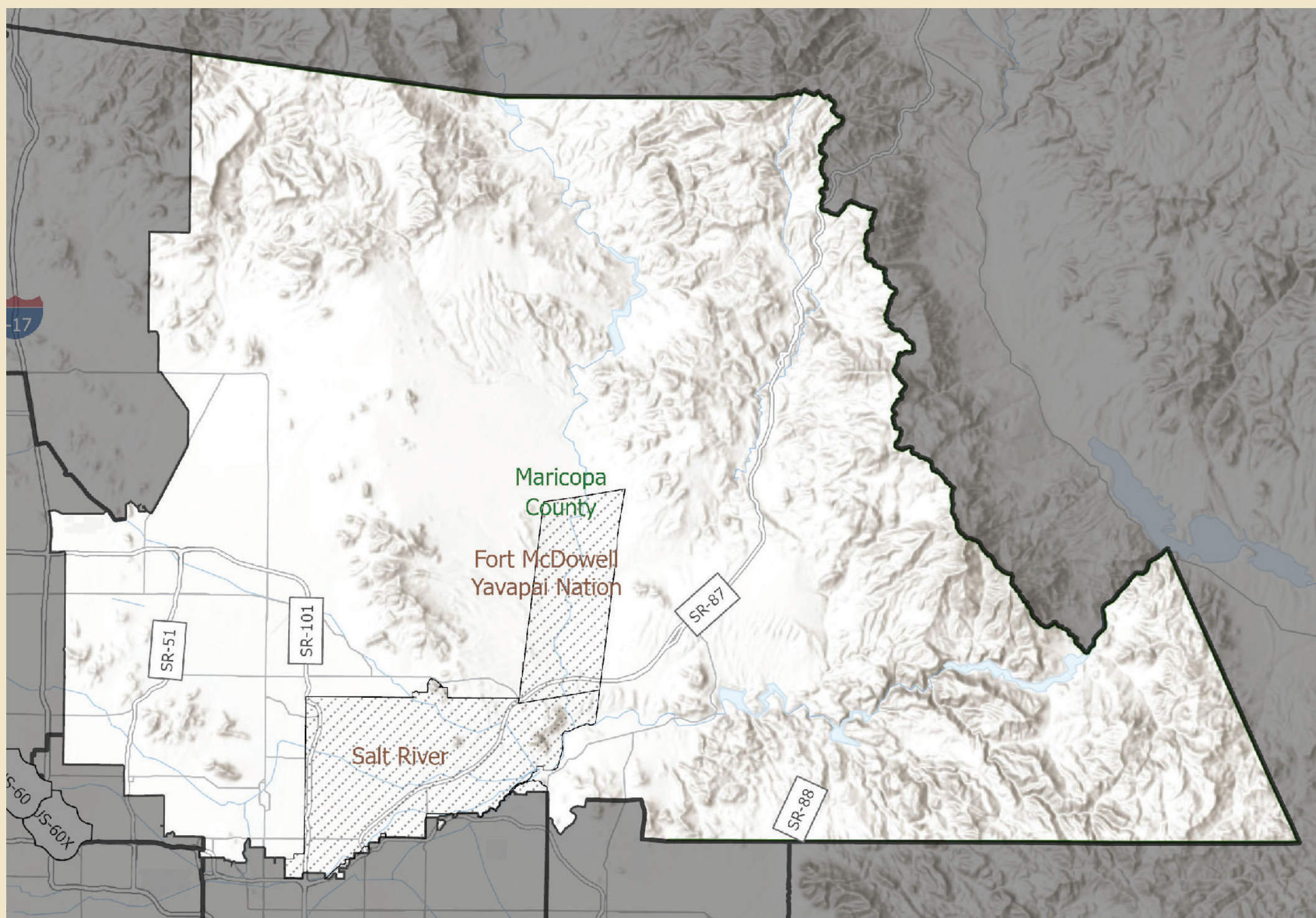

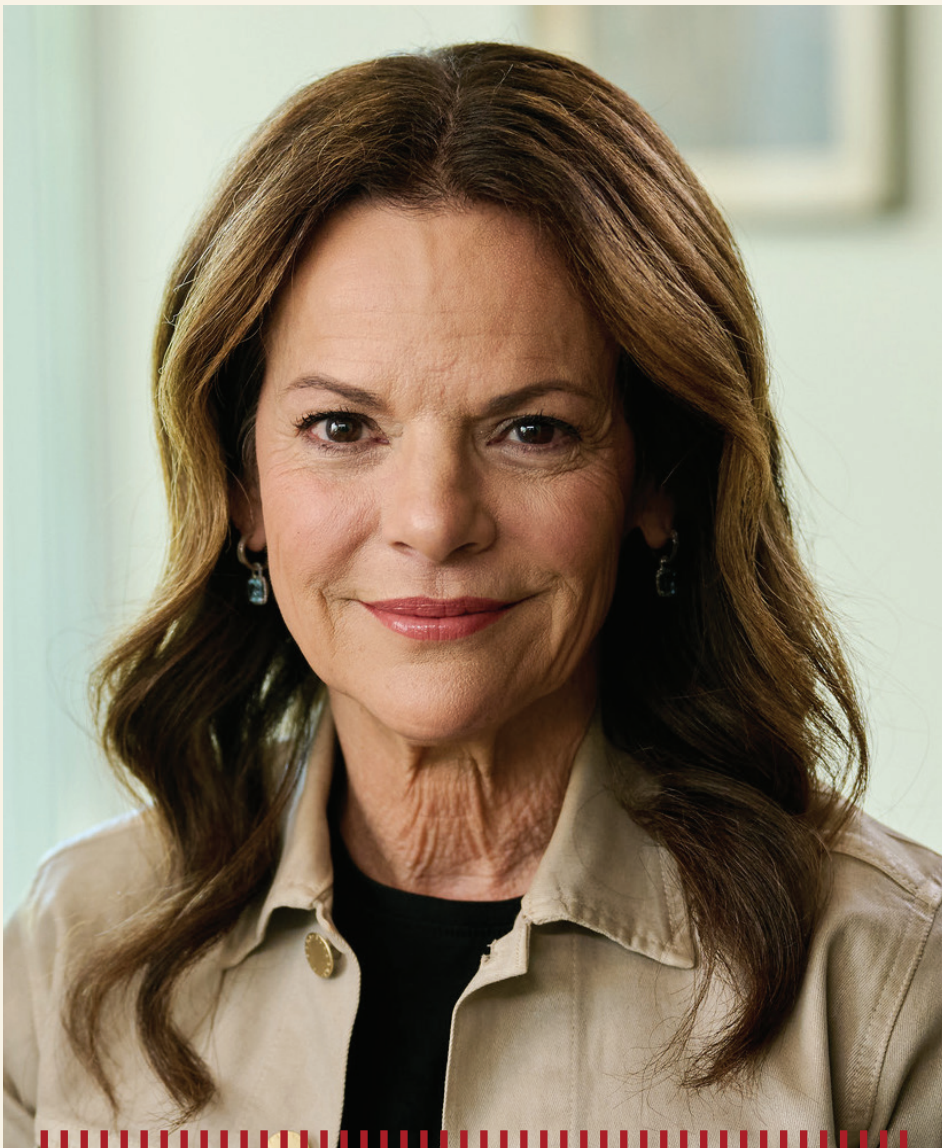

Marlene will stand up for Native Nations. Arizona is home to 22 tribes with two tribes in Arizona's 1st district – the Salt River Pima Maricopa Indian Community and the Ft. McDowell Yavapai Nation. Congress must recognize the sovereignty of the tribes and continue to build partnerships with our tribal communities. We also need to protect the water rights of Tribal nations and make sure we have the infrastructure in place so that our communities do not have their water stripped away. In Congress, Marlene will work to address housing costs, water access, expand rural broadband, and fight the GOP Medicaid cuts that threaten Arizona's rural hospitals. She will work closely with tribal leadership and bring much-needed resources to our tribes in Arizona.
